## Activities

Language Arts: Along with studying the letter Q, we began the unit in Happily Ever After centered on the book The Country Mouse and the City Mouse. The story is about cousins who visit each other in their respective home and learn whether they like a simple, safe life or a fancy life in danger. Students learned about the concepts we will be working on in this unit including the color brown, the shape rectangle, and the sizes long and short. Lastly, we reviewed the letters $\mathrm{O}, \mathrm{P}$, and Q .

Math: When we were making the 100 day necklaces, students had to make groups of 10 fruit loops to make sure they got to 100 . We discussed how 10 groups of 10 make 100 and we counted to 100 by tens. They used the paper markers to help keep track of how many they already had. Also, after predicting whether we thought the groundhog would see his shadow or not, we graphed the results.

Religion: We studied Chapter 15: "Jesus Has Many Friends". Students listened to the Bible story about how the Apostle Peter told people about Jesus and how they can be friends of Jesus. We spoke about what friends of Jesus do together and what we do. We also made a sharing necklace to remind us that people in our Church family share and help one another.
